Applicants must be citizens, non-citizen nationals or permanent residents of the US.	Applicant: MSW-prepared field instructor with 2 years each of supervisory and oncology practice experience.	Master's Training Grants in Clinical Oncology Social Work: Awarded to institutions to support training of second year master's degree students to provide psychosocial services to persons with cancer and their families. Annual Deadline: October 15 only.	Two-year grants (<i>new for 2012</i>) are made for \$12,000 annually (trainee award of \$10,000 and \$2,000 for faculty professional development).
	MSW-prepared applicants who are applying to or currently enrolled in a doctoral degree program in an accredited school of social work.	Doctoral Training Grants in Oncology Social Work: Support graduate students in programs that train individuals to conduct research related to oncology social work. Annual Deadline: October 15 only.	Initial two-year grant with annual funding of \$20,000 with possibility of two-year renewal.
	Postdoctoral fellows with 0-4 years of fellowship experience at time of expected award.	Postdoctoral Fellowships: Supports three of any of first five years of postdoctoral fellowship training.	1 to 3 year grants with progressive stipends of \$44,000, \$46,000, and \$48,000 per year, plus a \$4,000 per year fellowship allowance.
	Full-time junior faculty, typically within the initial four years of their first independent appointment.	Mentored Research Scholar Grants in Applied and Clinical Research: Provides support for mentored research and training to beginning investigators to become independent researchers as either clinician scientists or cancer control and prevention researchers.	Awards are for up to five years and for a maximum of \$135,000 per year plus 8% allowable indirect costs. Up to \$10,000 for support of the mentor may be included in the budget.
	Investigators in the first six years of an independent research career or faculty appointment.	Research Scholar Grants: Support investigator-initiated projects across the cancer research continuum.	Awards are for up to four years and for a maximum of \$200,000 per year, plus 20% allowable indirect costs.
	RSG applicants to the Cancer Control and Prevention Research Program ONLY may be at any career stage.	Research Scholar Grants in Cancer Control: Health Policy and Health Services Research: Supports research projects in health services and health policy.	
	[NB: Applicants for Postdoctoral Fellowships and Mentored Research Scholar Grants are eligible to apply in the priority focus area.]	Research Scholar Grants in Priority Program of Cancer Control - Health Disparities Research: Supports research projects that address reduction in cancer health disparities. Meritorious applications in psychosocial, behavioral, health policy and health services research that address cancer health disparities will receive priority funding.	As above <i>with the exception that population-based studies only may be up to five year awards and for a maximum of \$400,000 per year, plus 20% allowable indirect costs.</i>
